1. Police Report was made at this point due to the later unavailability of the Police Officers

The Police Report was presented by Sgt Julia Coney who had been working in Totteridge for the past 3 years, mainly in the Traffic Police. PC Susan Ianelli remains as the dedicated Ward Officer for Totteridge, and Rash Gill remains the PCSO DWO. This means that they work closely together and only on matters concerning Totteridge. They have organised many Community days in schools including a Day on Stranger Danger. Other Community activities have taken place at Waitrose, B&Q and also in various clubs where issues associated with Crime and Prevention and Health and Safety have been addressed. There have been regular TRA and Community Action panel meetings throughout the year. The Police have started a Community Police Newsletter. If residents send their email address to PC Ianelli she will give them information on Police Pop Up events.

Sgt Coney has worked mainly in the Traffic Police and amongst other duties their aim is to educate people to wear their seatbelts and not to use mobile phones whilst driving. The speed gun was used recently on Totteridge Lane and in Longland Drive. This is a pro-active team who work very hard. There are always two other officers available who would be on patrol in either a marked or unmarked police car.

2. Neighbourhood Watch

Kitty Nabarro was stepping down from the post of organiser, a role which she had filled for the last 20 years. She asked for a volunteer to fill her shoes. Kitty Nabarro was warmly thanked by the Vice-Chairman for her reliable and consistent reports and her utter and effective dedication to Neighbourhood Watch.
